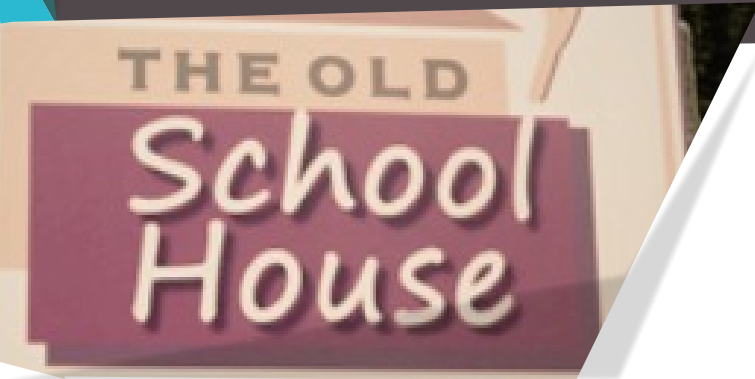

NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNCIL PATH KEEPER SCHEME

Hunton has joined this scheme, enabling a small group of volunteers, who are interested in the maintenance of the public rights of way network, both footpaths and bridleways to work in a safe environment with the support of North Yorkshire Countryside Access Service.

In our Parish we only have about 3 miles of paths and a similar length of bridleways to maintain. Jack Lane has already been cleared for the first time in many years.

The scheme gives permission to carry out basic maintenance tasks on the Rights of Way network across North Yorkshire (excluding the National Parks).

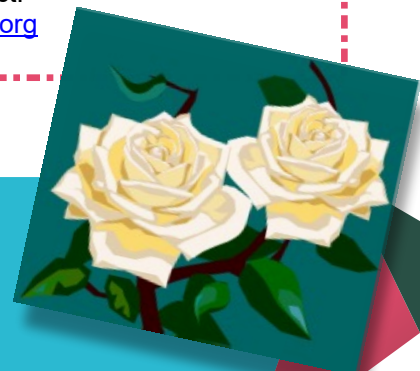
Permitted tasks

- Vegetation clearance; from along paths and around stiles, gates and signposts.
- Surface repairs; filling in potholes, clearing drainage channels, re-aligning steps.
- Minor bridge repairs; cleaning and clearing moss and weeds from decking.
- Signposts; straightening up leaning signposts or way-marker posts.
- Minor repairs to stiles and gates; with the landowner's permission.
- Waymarking; replacing old way-markers and adding new ones where necessary.

CLEAR AND ADDITIONAL SIGNPOSTING has two main purposes, to aid walkers and to reassure farmers people do not stray from the path.
