## **PC updates**

#### **Tree maintenance**

Following the removal of one damaged weeping willow, (these have a short healthy lifespan of around 40-50 years), we have commissioned a professional tree audit, with the aim of managing the large trees on the amenity area, to ensure their health and the safety of residents and visitors using the green spaces. That survey forms the basis for future management. We have created an annual contingency budget from the precept for future maintenance work.

## Flooding, Arrathorne junction

The PC has been working through the Spring and Summer with the landowner and officers from North Yorkshire Council Highways Area 1. This has involved site visits with all parties, to identify and resolve outstanding issues after initial remedial work was carried out earlier in the year. Highways Area 1 has recently been able to confirm that the final work is now scheduled by the end of the year, to connect drainage from the south side of the junction to existing drainage on the adjacent land. Hopefully, this will finally resolve the flooding of the road junction.

## 20's Plenty initiative

#### The Parish Council has received the following update:

Just to confirm it is still the intention to consult and advertise the intention to introduce 20mph speed limits on certain sections of the roads in the village. The first part of the process will involve formal details being sent to various organisations, such as parish councils, and to those properties within the sections of road in question, for comment, and it is hoped to do this early the New Year.' **NYC Highways, Area 1** 



#### Wildlife areas

We have hand cleared all three areas, to avoid disturbing wildlife. There are frogs and toads in the two areas by the beck, preparing to dig in for winter under old logs and vegetation.

We have planted daffodils in Phase 1 by Captain's Bridge and in Phase 2 behind the carpark, and spread some more annual seed., though Phase 2 is more suited to perennials (see photo). We hope to fundraise in the Spring - details later.
